

Following the success of the Art Nouveau Year, the Brussels-Capital Region is continuing its strategy of promoting its architectural heritage by declaring 2025 the year of Art Deco. 2025 also marks the centenary of the 1925 International Exhibition of Modern Decorative and Industrial Arts held in Paris, which offers a chance to revisit Brussels' Art Deco heritage through the lens of contemporary urban and

societal challenges. This approach goes beyond the traditional focus on aesthetics and the admiration of luxury. By examining the society that produced Art Deco, we discover the civic issues it addressed,

between the liberation of morals and the threat of economic, social and geopolitical crises. They shed light on the challenges we face today:

sustainable development,
the fight against
discrimination, decolonising
knowledge and the arts
and intergenerational
exchanges.

ART DECO RESOLUTELY MODERN?

With its geometric lines and sense of ornamentation, Art Deco was the artistic movement of the 1920s and 1930s. A true icon of the Roaring Twenties, its aesthetics thrived in furniture, decorative arts, and architectural facades alike. Characterised by geometric forms, lustrous materials, warm and contrasting colours with golden or silver accents, and a penchant for precious materials or their imitations, Art Deco also demonstrated a strong fascination with exoticism.

Inseparable from Art Deco was the concept of modernity, omnipresent in this era, imbued with a spirit of renewal that permeated all aspects of society. It aimed to achieve democratic emancipation, technological comfort, and enhanced leisure and mobility.

In 2025, Brussels is paying tribute to this architectural trend that has gone viral: Urban, visit.brussels and all their partners have put together a fully packed programme of exhibitions, events, visits and lectures in the capital's most beautiful Art Deco buildings!

HERITAGE DAYS 20 — 21 SEPTEMBER 2025

For 37 years, Urban has offered visitors the chance to rediscover and appreciate Brussels' cultural heritage over a weekend through the Heritage Days programme. This has grown into the largest cultural event in the country. Under the theme

ART DECO, Roaring Twenties, Crash Years,

this year's event highlights a broad spectrum of heritage: from buildings, facades and interiors to furniture, collections, intangible heritage and public spaces.

ACTIVITIES AROUND THE THEME

This year's Heritage Days programme features more than 200 different activities, including exhibitions, performances, films, lectures, and visits to emblematic buildings in all the city's 19 municipalities.

EXCEPTIONAL DISPLAYS AND EXCLUSIVE OPENINGS

Brussels is home to a wealth of emblematic buildings with a key role in the history of Art Deco and modernism. During the Heritage Days, visitors will have the chance to discover iconic locations such as radio house Flagey, the Van Buuren Gardens, BOZAR and the Résidence Palace.

What makes this event extra special is the exclusive access to spaces which are normally closed to the public. Visitors can enjoy behind-the-scenes tours of some of Brussels' best-kept architectural secrets, including Hôtel Riez, Maison Pelgrims, La Monnaie workshops, and the home of architect Henry Lacoste.

For those looking for unique experiences, there are visits to exceptional private homes, including the Glass House, the Vandevelde House, the Homem de Macédo House, Herrero House, Dotremont House and several houses by architect Louis Tenaerts.

This year, buildings will not be the sole focus of the programme. The iconic Cinema Galeries will host an exceptional film screening. Alexandra Rice's immersive film "Quartier Nomade" offers a unique glimpse into everyday life in Belgian fairground culture. This tradition was recognised as Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity by UNESCO in 2024.

MYTHICAL LOCATIONS, SPICY ENCOUNTERS AND FREEDOM OF EXPRESSION

After the tragic years of World War I, people wanted to live, dance and enjoy themselves again. The call for freedom and self-expression was also reflected in dance, music, fashion, and leisure, which left Brussels buzzing like never before.

Immerse yourself in a richly illustrated lecture on the legendary fashion house Norine Couture, where the concept of "Belgian fashion" was born.

Then follow the trail of secrets and jazz tones from the decadent 1920s and 1930s. In addition to well-known favourite L'Archiduc, discover a series of mythical cafes, bars and restaurants that made the interwar period in Brussels such a colourful time where freedom, seduction, and lust for life went hand in hand.

For those who still have any energy left after all that: end the day dancing! Let the rousing rhythms of Lindy Hop and Solo Jazz touch your soul during a dynamic workshop accompanied by Apollo Swing.

KEY FEMALE FIGURES IN BELGIAN ART DECO

The interwar period marked not only the flowering of the Art Deco style, but also an important step in women's emancipation. This programme therefore proudly shines a spotlight on the women who actively contributed to this artistic movement as well as to the struggle for women's rights.

Delve into the archives of Céline Dangotte, a lesser-known but fascinating figure in the Belgian Art Deco movement. From 1912 until the outbreak of World War II, she ran her own decoration business, L'Art Décoratif C. Dangotte (AD/CD), and made a name for herself in this very male-dominated field. Her artistic work is inseparable from her outspoken feminist struggle.

In addition, discover the oeuvre of talented painter and pioneer Lina Cauchie, one of the first women admitted to the Académie des Beaux-Arts. Her work and life were intertwined with the famous Maison Cauchie, and bear witness to her artistic flair and social engagement.

If you want to understand all the dimensions of Art Deco, don't miss Elisabeth Gérard's fascinating lecture. She uses the stories of decorators, designers, architects and craftswomen to show how women played a fundamental role in shaping Belgian architecture of the interwar period.

UNMISSABLE CULINARY DELIGHTS

When we think of the Roaring Twenties, jazz bands and chic cocktail tables immediately come to mind. A lesser known fact is that partygoers of that era also encountered sandwiches for the first time, such as those dispensed by "Au Suisse's" first vending machine. During a culinary tour, De Brigade takes you through the profound technological and social shifts of the interwar period and shows how they changed eating habits in Brussels forever. However, the kitchen is not the only domain that shaped the interwar period, as Belgian beer culture also underwent a real transformation. Brasseries Atlas, an iconic establishment in Anderlecht, carries on the tradition of Brussels' rich brewing past: here. the industrial prestige of a bygone age comes alive. Under the title ATLAS OF ATLAS, this diverse heritage will be presented through an exhibition in the historic brewery buildings and an accompanying book (in preparation).

History is best tasted in practice. Beer experts Hélène (Hoppyz) and Carien (Hoppiness) invite visitors to participate in a fascinating introduction to authentic beer styles from the 1920s and 1930s. In their tasting workshops, they show how the interwar period laid the building blocks for today's rich and diverse Belgian beer culture.

PRACTICAL INFO

This year, a leaflet with a summary of the programme has been drawn up in Dutch, French and English. It can be obtained at numerous locations (urban.brussels, Halles Saint-Géry, local authorities, tourism services, libraries and participating venues).

The full programme will be available in early September on the website heritagedays. urban.brussels, coinciding with the opening of bookings.

ICONIC MONUMENTS AND PRIVATELYOWNED SITES: FOLLOW THE GUIDE!

The Brussels-Capital Region boasts a unique Art Deco heritage, as diverse as the tastes of the patrons of the time. Sometimes discreet, sometimes monumental – from intricately designed cornices on residential buildings to sprawling villas with swimming pools — the streets of Brussels are brimming with treasures waiting to be discovered or rediscovered.

To this end, a large number of guided tour associations such as Pro Vélo, ARAU, Arkadia, Korei, Bruxelles

Bavard, Itinéraires, Brussels Art Deco Society and CIVA, as well as numerous municipal partners such as the communes of Anderlecht, Schaerbeek, Forest, Ixelles, Ganshoren and the City of Brussels, are offering rich and

varied programmes of their own throughout 2025.

One of the highlights of the line-up is the Brussels Art Nouveau Art Deco Festival (BANAD Festival), from Saturday 15 to Sunday 30 March, organised by Explore.Brussels.

The event includes visits to some sixty interiors that are usually closed to the public, with some being made accessible for the very first time, and around twenty themed guided tours for visitors to follow on foot or by bike.

It's the perfect opportunity to peek inside some of Brussels' Art Deco jewels, such as: Villa Empain, the former Grand Eldorado cinema, Brussels Central Station and its Royal Lounge, the National Basilica of the Sacred Heart, Bozar Centre for Fine Arts, Hotel Riez, the home of Henri Draps, the Queen Elizabeth Medical Foundation, Anderlecht's Orthodox Synagogue, the Palais de la Folle Chanson, Joseph Marien stadium, Forest town hall, the Flagey building, Tenaerts House, Résidence Palace, the Pavillons Français apartment building, the Saint-Josse swimming baths and the former Colpaert glassworks.

As part of the festival, Pro Vélo offers guided bike tours in French on the following themes: "Koekelberg et Jette, de l'Art nouveau à l'Art déco", "L'Art déco s'expose à Laeken", "Art déco et Modernisme" (Art Deco and Modernism, also available in English), "Jean Baptiste Dewin, le maître des hôpitaux et des bestiaires", "Schaerbeek, fleuron de l'architecture de l'Entre-deux-guerres", "Michel Polak, le chantre du luxe et de la modernité", "Antoine Courtens, le disciple devenu maître" and "Henry Van De Velde, le moderniste".

The commune of Ganshoren is organizing guided tours in French and Dutch of the "Jean Dehaye, architect and defender of Horta's work" exhibition as part of BANAD, and also later in the year. Several dates are also scheduled for walks that take visitors on a tour of the Art Deco gems nestled in the Basilica district.

Throughout the summer, the municipality of Schaerbeek is offering "Les Estivales", a series of guided tours in French and Dutch: tours of the Flower district, the Terdelt garden city and the Vergote square, and visits to the exhibitions "Loisirs-Plezier Brussels 1920-1940" and "The work of Georges Mansy".

Also during BANAD, Bruxelles Bayard offers tours in French, Dutch and English on the theme of "Taverns that tell of the splendour of Art nouveau and Art Deco", with a beer tasting as a bonus. There will also be tours in French and Dutch on the theme of "L'Art Déco et le modernisme à Woluwe-Si-Plaisante". Or, in French, "L'ancien port de Bruxelles, l'Art Déco prend le large", "L'Art Déco à Jette sur les traces de Loulou", "Art nouveau et Art Déco autour d'un bijou mal-aimé : la basilique de Koekelberg", "Avec Dewin, l'élégante transition de l'Art nouveau à l'Art Déco", "Le cimetière d'Ixelles, so famous, so Art Deco". Later in the year, the non-profit organisation will also be covering other topics in French: "Entre la courbe et la ligne, le coeur de Saint-Gilles balance", "Art Déco dans l'art funéraire au cimetière d'Ixelles" and "Anderlecht, Eden de l'Art Déco".


Festival, as well as offering guided visits throughout the year for individuals on fixed dates, or for groups by prior arrangement. They cover a wide range of themes, from visits to Art Deco cinemas to "Art Deco

and Modernism" walks in various municipalities such as Watermael-Boitsfort, Etterbeek, Anderlecht, Uccle or Brussels Centre, as well as visits to exhibitions: "Around Art Deco" at Musée van Buuren, "Art Deco 1925 >< Fashion 2025" at Halles Saint-Géry or the Art Deco exhibition at Musée BELvue. Tours inside some buildings will also be available at the van Buuren Museum & Gardens, the Forest town hall, the Flagey "liner", the National Basilica of the Sacred Heart or backstage at the former Theatre Saint-Michel.

The Korei association is organising walks and tours of the buildings' interiors, mainly in Dutch, but also in French and English. The walks take participants along Avenue Franklin Roosevelt, through the Pentagon and canal zone, and into the Berkendael, Brugmann and Observatoire districts in Uccle. The Forest town hall, Villa Empain, van Buuren Museum, Flagey, La Nouvelle Maison by Henry Van de Velde, the National Basilica of the Sacred Heart, Maison Lagasse and Central Station are among the interior visits on the association's programme.

From May, the Brussels Art Deco Society is offering guided tours of 'The Hotel Riez, an Art Deco gem in the Maritime Quarter of Molenbeek-Saint-Jean', in French, Dutch and English. The schedule also includes tours of the "Art Deco 1925 × Fashion 2025" exhibition, including talks by participating designers.

Arau is offering "Art Déco, entre commerces et entrepôts", "de Molière à Albert, nouvelles perspectives Art Déco", "Volta, des cités sociales à Ixelles", "Art Déco et modernisme : quartier Coghen", "Art Déco et modernisme : quartier Churchill", "Koekelberg Art Deco", "Merveilles de l'Art Déco du Wolvendael au Dieweg", "Art Déco populaire au quartier maritime", "Bockstael, Art Déco pour tous", "Schaerbeek, Art Déco au quartier des bienfaiteurs", "Jette, côté Art Déco", "Art nouveau et Art Déco dans les Marolles", "Forest, l'Union fait l'Art Déco", "Art Déco tennoodois, des cliniques et des bains", "Art Déco à

Anderlecht" in French and "Logis Floréal, regionalist Art Deco", "Altitude 100: At the summit of Art Nouveau and Art Deco", "From Art Nouveau to Art Deco in Schaerbeek" in French and English.

All year long, the non-profit organization Itinéraires organises guided tours, subject to booking, on the theme of Art Deco in various districts: in the city centre (from Art Nouveau to Art Deco), around the canal, in Ixelles, Jette, Molenbeek-Saint-Jean, Uccle, in the Coghen district and in the Embassies district.

Throughout the summer, Bozar will be offering guided tours on the theme of "Horta & Beutler" in French and Dutch.

Van Buuren Museum & Gardens

The Art & History Museum officially opened on June 13, 2025, two new permanent exhibition halls dedicated to its Art Nouveau & Art Deco collections.

The Clockarium, housed in a beautiful Schaerbeek Art Deco house, features a collection of period earthenware mantelpiece ornaments.

Many of these sites are accessible through the Art Nouveau Pass, which evolves into the Art Nouveau Art Deco Pass. This new combined ticket includes,in addition to nine Art Nouveau sites, entry to several Art Deco landmarks across the capital.

Draw me a train. This exhibition is designed to highlight the work of some of the greatest artists of their time, who expressed the beauty of the train in their work. Carriages from the 1930s, designed by Henry van de Velde, have also been restored for the occasion.

LES HALLES SAINT-GÉRY

In 2025, the Halles Saint-Géry places Art Deco at the heart of their entire program, with a series of exhibitions on diverse themes, a spotlight on intangible heritage such as gastronomy, conferences and a look at Art Deco beyond our borders. The initiative is driven by a strong commitment to broad accessibility: free entry to all exhibitions, occasional cultural mediation initiatives, and fully accessible facilities for people with reduced mobility.

Art Deco Cinemas in Brussels

Art Deco 1925 >< Mode 2025

"Art Deco 1925 >< Mode 2025" offers a reinterpretation of Art Deco through the prism of 10 Brussels designers. Echoing the images and magazines of the period, in which drawings and photographs show the creativity of dressmakers between the wars, each designer will present his or her contemporary vision of the codes of the movement in a fashion silhouette.

ART DECO FAIR AND FESTIVAL

On Saturday 29 and Sunday 30 March 2025, the 10th edition of BANAD's Art Nouveau and Art Deco objects fair took place in Brussels' superb Art Nouveau School No. 13. Around fifty collectors and dealers presented objects, small pieces of furniture, books and posters from the period.

The fair also included a salon for heritage restorers and, on Sunday, a day of expert appraisals by Jean-Jacques Wattel and Art Research Paris.

Associations working to raise awareness of Brussels' heritage were also present on both days, including Urban, which presented its publications there.

Lectures, previews, guided tours or festive events: from 12 to 18 May, the Art Deco at Home festival offered a specific event every evening at a different venue, organised by one of the partners of the Art Deco at Home consortium – the Boghossian Foundation, the van Buuren Museum & Gardens, the Autrique House and the Horta Museum.

GREEN SPACES

The capital's green spaces are also be taking part in the festivities! The cemeteries of the City of Brussels will be participating in the Printemps des Cimetières and CIVA is hosting its annual Garden Tales festival, which encourages the public to (re)discover the green spaces of the interwar period.

CLASSES DU PATRIMOINE

In parallel, the Classes du Patrimoine are partnering with van Buuren Museum & Gardens to organise activities for schools. Several museums are adapting their programming to make exhibitions accessible to young audiences and families.

PUBLICATIONS

Several museums are also offering publications as part of their temporary exhibitions. Racines is also preparing a new Beau Livre on "Art Deco Homes", by author Cécile Dubois. Demeures Historiques et Jardins de Belgique published an issue devoted to

Belgium in the spring. A new edition of Natrimoine magazine also comes out this summer.
